- Established in 1827 as the Maryland State Library
- Collection originally had “all branches of knowledge”
- Focus shifted to legal materials over time
- Moved with Court of Appeals to new courthouse in 1903
- Moved to current location in 1972 and became part of Judicial branch in 1978

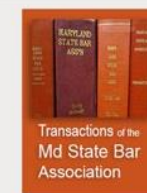

Welcome to the Thurgood Marshall State Law Library. We are open for visitors without an appointment.

Our public computer stations are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Staff will impose a 15-minute limit if patrons are waiting.

The internet and our databases are accessible via WiFi. If you bring a laptop, time restrictions will not apply.

If you bring a flash drive, you may scan items using our photocopiers at no cost. Otherwise, standard copier and printer fees will apply. (April 4, 2022)

The Thurgood Marshall State Law Library is located in Annapolis, Maryland. The Library is in the first floor of the Courts of Appeals Building, just outside of downtown Annapolis at 361 Rowe Boulevard, just one block south of the Navy Stadium.

Maryland Code and Rules Sources

Maryland Code and Court Rules

The Maryland Code is a compilation of the statutes and is generally organized by subject (e.g., Criminal Law Article, Family Law Article). The Supreme Court of Maryland, the highest court, promulgates rules that govern the practice and procedure in state courts. The Code and Rules are available online through multiple sources.

Publishers of the three websites linked above manage the timing of their updates. The Library cannot guarantee that material contained on their pages reflects the latest amendments to the Maryland Code. Thus, researchers should verify currency with the website publisher or the original institutional author. These online versions do not contain annotations. Annotated versions of the current and superseded Maryland Code are available at the Library through print and database subscriptions.

Laws of Maryland

Maryland statutes are passed by the General Assembly, Maryland's legislative body. The Laws of the State of Maryland is a chronological collection of laws passed by the General Assembly. They are also referred to as session laws.

- **Access the Archives of Maryland Online** to view the session laws from the 1600s to the present.
- The *Laws of Maryland* are available at the Library in print and through database subscriptions.

Maryland House and Senate Journals

The Maryland House and Senate Journals are records of the proceedings of the Maryland House of Delegates and the Maryland Senate Sessions.

- The Maryland House and Senate Journals are available at the Library in print, microfilm, and through database subscriptions.

Maryland Case Law Sources

Reported and unreported opinions of the Supreme Court of Maryland (formerly the Court of Appeals) and the Appellate Court of Maryland (formerly the Court of Special Appeals) are available through multiple sources. The Library's collection provides in-person access to print and digital copies of reported opinions. In addition, unreported opinions of the Appellate Court of Maryland are available on microfilm. Contact the Library if you would like assistance locating a reported or unreported opinion.

3. Maryland Pattern Jury Instructions

Research Note: Currentness

Both MSBA titles are loose-leaf publications. This means that the pages are contained in a binder. The Library updates the contents of the publication by removing amended pages and replacing them with new pages. The old pages are then discarded. This is a common publication and update format for legal publications.

Supplements are not published on a regular schedule. Check the title page or supplement page of the binder to determine the date of the last update.

Maryland Civil Jury Instructions and Commentary was published by the Michie Company in 1993. There is one update, which was issued in 1996.

Statute/Code Section _____	Review history at the end of the Code section; this will cite to Chapter laws enacted or amended the statute.
Chapter Law & Year _____	Each Chapter law will include a preamble describing bill and illustrate new, changed, and deleted text from a statute. Revisor's notes may provide legislative intent.
Senate/House Bill Number _____	The Bill number is found at the beginning of the Chapter law. Use this to find Bill files and other materials created while enacting the legislation.

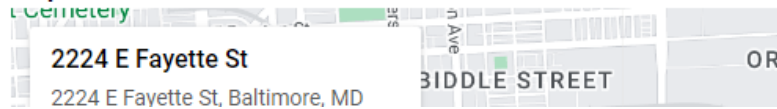





Protective Order Generally

In Maryland, you can obtain an order of

6: Temporary Protective Order Hearing.
 You must attend a Temporary Protective Order hearing to extend the length and scope of protection contained in the Interim Protective Order. If the other side has not received a copy (i.e. been served), the Court will issue a Temporary Protective Order and serve the abuser with notice of the final hearing.
Read the Law: Md. Code, Family Law ("Fam. Law") § 4-504 and 4-504.1
